Project Objectives	The overall goal of the water harvesting project is to provide additional sources of water supply in Jebal Al Akhdar area through effective implementation of water harvesting techniques in order to increase and stabilize agricultural production. The objective of this T.A. is to carry out a Feasibility Study to enable the Libyan Authorities to determine the technical, social, economic and financial feasibility and, consequently, funding of the water harvesting project.				
Project Scope	The proposed study includes the preparation of a Feasibility Study for the construction of water harvesting structures, such as hill reservoirs and to widespread the utilization of rainwater harvesting techniques to capture and store rainwater for agricultural use.				
Project justification	The project is in line with "Jeddah Declaration" and IDB 1440 Vision since it contributes to fifth Thrust of Prospering the People. Rainwater harvesting appears to be the only feasible alternative for augmenting existing water resources in Jebal Al Akhdar area. Various forms of water harvesting have been used in Jebal Al Akhdar area. But the scale of its utilization is still low. The project will ensure (i) improving the availability of water resources in the target area through construction of water harvesting structures, (ii) improving the productivity of rain-fed crop in the target area through application of supplementary irrigation using modern irrigation system, (iii) using drought tolerant wheat and barley varieties, (iv) improving the quality of life of the rural population as it will stabilize the nomadic population around the water structures and reduce their vulnerability during drought, (v) reducing rural-urban migration, and develop socio-economic activities in the project area.
